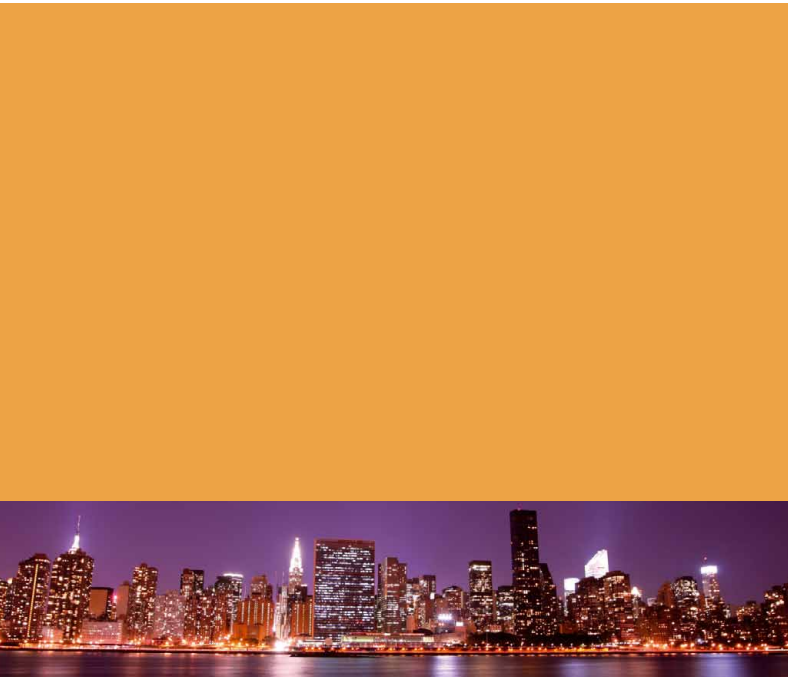

INTERESTING WALKS AND PLACES TO VISIT

✕ "The Block Beautiful..."

A collection of lovely row houses on 19th Street between Third Avenue and Irving Place, mainly stuccoed buildings that were remodeled early in the 20th century by Frederick J. Sterner. The block was an informal colony for artists and writers in the 1920s and 1930s, such as author Ida Tarbell, painter Cecilia Beaux, and the sculptor Zolnay, music critic and novelist Carl Van Vechten, painters George Bellows and Robert Chanler.

✕ The Brooklyn Botanical Garden

BBG is a tranquil, 52-acre urban oasis featuring more than 11,000 different kinds of plants from around the world. The Garden is made up of many exquisite and historic specialty gardens, including the Japanese-Hill-and-Pond-Garden, the Children's Garden, the Native Flora Garden, the Cranford Rose Garden, the Alice Recknagel Ireys Fragrance Garden, and the Steinhardt Conservatory.
